Policy Number: 16 - UNIFORM POLICY REV:1

Aims:

1. To give children pride in their school.
2. To prevent competition between pupils in matters of dress.
3. To save the parents the burden of having to provide their children with a wide variety of clothes and to avoid designer label rivalry.
4. To ensure the safety especially at P.E. time and in the playground.
5. To help to identify children when on extra curricular activities.

UNIFORM

Children attending Suncroft National School are expected to wear the school uniform. The uniform consists of:

Junior and Senior Infants

The Suncroft School track-suit with the school crest on it.

Boys and Girls 1st to 6th Class

Light blue shirt/collared t-shirt, grey trousers and navy cardigan/jumper with school crest. A navy tie. A grey pinafore/skirt is optional for girls. Tights or socks must be navy or grey.

Footwear

Footwear appropriate to school to be worn by both boys and girls.

P.E.

On P.E. days the school tracksuit and runners must be worn. No navy tracksuit and runners - no P.E.

If the uniform is not worn a written note of explanation is required. Where no explanation has been offered on three occasions in a month a standard letter will be posted home by the class teacher. A record will be kept in the school of all such communication.

Jewellery

Necklaces must be kept under the shirt/t-shirt. Any other jewellery and spectacles must be removed for P.E.

By working together, parents and school, we can achieve and maintain a high standard of uniform dress. The children are encouraged to have a sense of pride in their uniform and it is the aim, that they will always see it as a badge of identity with their school.
